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## The New Racism

Before I started this article, I checked a few definitions of racism. They all mentioned a belief that human character and abilities are determined by race and that one race is better than another. I think the definitions are behind the times. Modern racism includes, in addition to those old ideas, a conviction that privileges and protections should be apportioned according to race, a belief that some races are more deserving than others.

For example, when a cop kills a black man and the black community explodes in protest, and then when a cop kills a white man and the black community ignores it, that's a form of racism. It shouldn't matter if the victim is black or white. What should matter is that a human being was killed by a cop.

When Hispanics in the electorate vote according to Hispanic interests rather than according to what's good for Americans, that's racism. Political decisions should be based on what's good for the people or for the country, not on what's good for one race.

When a political candidate seeks the vote of a racial segment of the electorate, that's racism. When members of Congress form a caucus based on race, that's racism. When race is the reason that a person is hired or not hired for a job, that's racism. When race is the reason that a person is accepted or not accepted in a school, that's racism. Whenever political and policy decisions are made on the basis of race, that's racism. Whether or not such policies and practices are bad is a matter of opinion. However, when they are pursued in the name of racial equality, they reveal the ignorance or the hypocrisy of those who pursue them. ¶

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## Quarantine

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## Conspiracy Theory

There aren't any constitutionally imposed eligibility requirements for the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Regarding his election, the Constitution says only that he shall be elected by the members of the House of Representatives. Thus far, the Speaker has always been elected from within the membership of the House of representatives. However, that need not always be the case. In theory, anybody could be elected to the position.

That circumstance was a central facet of a conspiracy theory that I encountered, many years ago. The idea is that some group of conspirators who have access to covert resources — e.g. CIA, DIA, Secret Service, or some “Black Ops” group — might be able to “persuade” a majority of the members of the House of Representatives to elect as Speaker an individual favored by the conspirators. Then, if they arranged the deaths of both the President and the Vice President, their man would become President. The procedure might be far less expensive and time-consuming than entering their man into a presidential election campaign, and it would have a far higher probability of success.

There are a few potential obstacles to the plan. For example, it might be difficult to “get the goods” on a sufficient number of Representatives. Of course, if there aren't any handy scandals to unearth, then the conspirators could fabricate them as needed. Somebody might renege on his deal, causing complications. A random act of “terrorism” ought to silence him. There might be objections that the new President wasn't actually an elected Representative. There are other figures in the presidential succession who aren't elected. Such complications haven't usually been too much of an obstacle to ruthless people in government who wanted something.

I was recently reminded of the old conspiracy theory while reading the September 2003 issue of *Ron Paul's Freedom Report*. Here's an excerpt.

“The *Continuity of Government Commission* (COGC), spearheaded by the Brookings Institution and the American Enterprise Institute,

recently issued proposals for the operation of Congress following a catastrophic terrorist attack. Specifically, COGC advocates a *constitutional amendment* calling for the *appointment of individuals to the House of Representatives* to fill the seats of dead or incapacitated members — a first in American history.

**“An examination of the proposal reveals that it is both unnecessary and dangerous.**

“Note that COGC is *self-commissioned*, its members being neither elected nor appointed by any government body. The biographies of the commissioners demonstrate that COGC is made up mostly of *professional lobbyists*....”

Such a constitutional amendment might make things a lot easier for conspirators trying to place their man in the presidency. A convenient “terrorist” event might create a vacancy that their “candidate” could be **appointed** to fill. A few more incidents might allow the conspirators to fill a few more vacancies with appointees, replacing uncooperative elected Representatives. Then, the new Speaker is elected, the President and the Vice President are eliminated, and voilà! The fait is accompli.

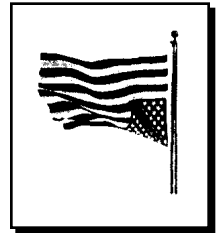

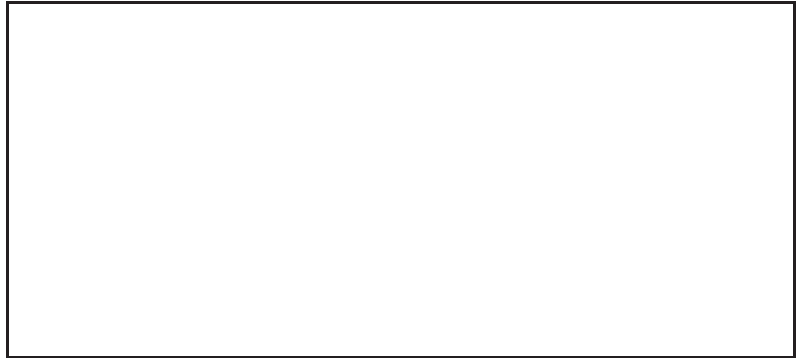
