The *Declaration of Independence* proclaims certain ideas.

- All men are created equal.
- God endowed men with certain inalienable rights, including life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.
- The legitimate purpose of governments is to secure such rights.
- Governments derive their just powers from the consent of the governed.
- If a government becomes destructive of such ends, then the people have the right to abolish it and to create a new one in its place.

When I was young, I uncritically accepted those ideas. As my knowledge and experience grew, I came to understand them differently. I realized that men are not all created equal. It was a lie in 1776 and it's a lie today. The idea that rights come from God is as false as was the idea of the divine right of kings. Neither kings nor rights come from God. If something is inalienable, then that means that it can't be

Sometimes I watch *Stories from the Stage*, on PBS. Even if some of the stories aren't interesting, they can still provide something innocuous for me to watch while I'm eating my lunch. Some of them are annoying, and those can provide me with a reason to write an article.

On one episode of *Stories from the Stage*, [Changed Forever 9/11](#), a creative arts therapist named Jude Treder-Wolff told a story about a 9/11 anniversary event that she attended in 2015. The event was held annually by an organization called Voices of September

taken away. Rights are taken away all the time, so they're not inalienable. The purpose of government isn't to secure rights, but to control people. The new one will always turn out to be just as bad as the one that it replaced.

People are highly susceptible to being deceived and manipulated by such politically motivated documents as *The Declaration of Independence*. Alexis de Tocqueville noted that, in a democracy, people get the kind of government that they deserve. The U.S. government isn't a democracy but I suppose that it's close enough for de Tocqueville's comment to apply. As long as people continue to speak like children, think like children, and reason like children, they're going to have paternalistic governments that treat them like children. ↴

Family Resemblance

Some time ago, I read a story called *Family Resemblance*, by Alan E. Nourse, © 1953, in *An ABC of Science Fiction*, edited by Tom Boardman, Jr. A character in the story believed that people don't have common ancestors with monkeys, but with pigs. He claimed that although there's anthropological and paleontological evidence in support of ape ancestry, there's better anatomical, physiological, embryological, and psychological evidence in support of pig ancestry. I didn't try to verify his points, but I like things that challenge the scientists. So, here's a summary of his points, as he presented them.

- Students in embryology courses study pig embryos because they're essentially identical to human embryos. They don't become distinguishable from human embryos until the last few weeks of gestation.
- After birth, the organs and viscera, and their arrangements, are practically identical in pigs and humans. The size, placement, shape, and functions of all organs are the same.

- Pigs are just as gluttonous, dirty, selfish, lazy, treacherous, and pugnacious as humans.

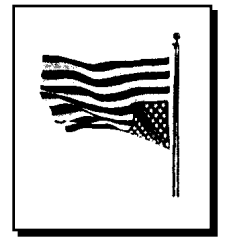
Now that last one is a family resemblance for sure. Maybe the people who refer to cops as pigs are closer to the truth than I'd previously believed. 🐷

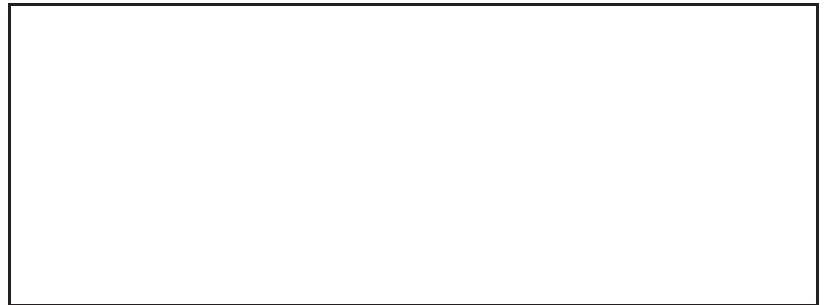
The [funding plan](#) that I announced in the June issue hasn't worked out very well. In fact, it hasn't worked out at all. So, I thought of an even better funding plan.
